ORDINANCE NO. 16-10

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 24, ARTICLE VI
OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF DUPO, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the Village of Dupu, St. Clair County, Illinois, is a duly created, organized and validly existing municipality of the State of Illinois under the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including particularly the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held in the Village of Dupu, Illinois at the Dupu Village Hall, 107 N. Second Street, on November 7, 2016 at 7:00 pm, before the Village Board of Dupu and notice of said meeting was duly given; and

WHEREAS, the parking of vehicles on grass, on dirt, and in fields has been a concern to public safety, health, and welfare of the citizens of Dupu, Illinois as it can cause structural damage to critical utilities and create depressions for stagnant water which in turn provides breeding habitats for mosquitoes; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Revised Code of Ordinances of Dupu, Illinois was presented creating Sections 24-6-12 and 24-6-13 of Chapter 24, Article VI of the Revised Code of Ordinances of Dupu, Illinois requiring (1) all motorized vehicles and (2) all trailers weighing over 1,000 pounds which are parked on a residential plot of land within the Village to be parked on an improved surface of concrete, asphalt, gravel, or other permeable pavement; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Trustees believe that the aforementioned amendment to be in the best interests of the Village and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Dupu, Illinois has recommended the approval of said amendment creating the aforementioned section of the Revised Code of Ordinances of Dupu, Illinois;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DUPO, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: Recitals. The aforementioned recitals are hereby adopted as findings by the Village Board, and incorporated herein.

Section 2: Amendment. The request for an amendment to create Sections 24-6-12 and 24-6-13 of Chapter 24, Article VI of the Revised Code of Ordinances of Dupu, Illinois as follows:

24-6-12 PROHIBITION ON PARKING A MOTORIZED VEHICLE ON AN UNIMPROVED RESIDENTIAL SURFACE. All motorized vehicles parked on a residential plot of land within the Village must be parked on an improved surface of concrete, asphalt, gravel, or other permeable pavement in residential areas and that surface must be properly maintained as an improved parking surface. It shall be unlawful for a motorized vehicle parked on a residential plot of land to be parked on grass, on dirt, or on any unimproved surface within the Village. Violators of this provision will be subject to fines in accordance with Section 24-6-9.

24-6-13 PROHIBITION ON PARKING A TRAILER ON AN UNIMPROVED RESIDENTIAL SURFACE. All trailers weighing over **one-thousand (1,000) pounds** parked on a residential plot of land within the Village must be parked on an improved surface of concrete, asphalt, gravel, or other permeable pavement in residential areas and that surface must be properly maintained as an improved parking surface. It shall be unlawful for a trailer weighing over **one-thousand (1,000) pounds** parked on a residential plot of land to be parked on grass, on dirt, or on any unimproved surface within the Village. Violators of this provision will be subject to fines in accordance with Section 24-6-9.

is APPROVED. The Revised Code of Ordinances of Dupu, Illinois shall reflect such amendment.

Section 3: Severability of Provisions. Each section, paragraph, sentence, clause and provision of this Ordinance is severable, and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.


Section 4: Conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5: Effective. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law and beginning on January 1, 2017.


