AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE "D" TO CHAPTER 24, ARTICLE IV CHANGING THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL SIDE AND RESIDENTIAL STREETS TO 20 MPH

WHEREAS, the Village of Dupo, St. Clair County, Illinois ("Village"), is a duly created, organized and validly existing municipality of the State of Illinois under the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including particularly the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held in the Village of Dupo, Illinois at the Dupo Village Hall, 107 N. Second Street, on April 16, 2018 at 7:00 pm, before the Village Board of Dupo and notice of said hearing was duly given; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority pursuant to 625 ILCS 5/11-605 to regulate the speed limit on roadways, streets, and alleys in its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 24, Article IV, Section 24-4-2(F) of the Village's Revised Code of Ordinances provides that the speed limits on the various streets shall be approved by the Village Board; and

WHEREAS, Schedule "D" referenced in Section 24-4-2(F) sets forth certain speed zones in the Village's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that for all side and residential streets in the Village that the speed limit on such streets shall be 20 MPH, and such is in the best interests of the public's health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Dupo, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend Schedule "D" of its Revised Code of Ordinances by making the following addition:

"All side & residential streets – 20 MPH Entire Distance"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DUPO, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section One:</u> The aforementioned recitals are hereby adopted as findings by the Village Board, and incorporated herein.

<u>Section Two</u>: The lowering of the speed limit to 20 MPH on all side and residential streets in the Village is in the best interest to the public's health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Dupo, Illinois.

Section Three: Schedule "D" of the Village's Revised Code of Ordnances as referenced

in Chapter 24. Article IV, Section 24-4-2(F) shall be amended to include the following: "All side & residential streets - 20 MPH Entire Distance". See Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

Section Four: The Village shall replace and/or install all necessary signage to effectuate the change in speed limit on all side and residential streets in the Village.

Section Five: The various portions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly declared to be severable, and the invalidity of any such portion of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other portions of this Ordinance, which shall be enforced to the fullest extent possible.

Section Six: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

ARTICLE IV - DRIVING RULES

The Illinois Vehicle Code, Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 625, Section 11, entitled "Rules of the Road", as passed, approved and amended by the Illinois General Assembly is hereby adopted by the Village and the provisions thereof shall be controlling within the corporate limits of the Village except for the following changes, deletions and omissions:

(A) <u>Omissions:</u>

(1) Omit Sections 11-207, 11-208.1, 11-208.2, 11-209.1, 11-302, 11-303, 11-310(f), 11-313, 11-401 to and including 11-416, 11-602, 11-603, 11-604, 11-606(b), 11-608, 11-1419, and 11-1422.

(B) <u>Changes and Additions:</u>

- (1) Change 11-904(a) to read: "Preferential right-of-way at an intersection may be indicated by stop or yield signs as authorized by this Code."
- (2) Change 11-1416(a) to read: "Any person who shall willfully and unnecessarily attempt to delay, hinder or obstruct any other person in lawfully driving and traveling upon or along any highway within this State or who shall offer for barter or sale, merchandise on said highway so as to interfere with the effective movement of traffic shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a violation of this Code."

24-4-2 DRIVING RULES.

- (A) <u>Careless Driving.</u> It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle in the Village in a careless manner so as to interfere with the safe or lawful operation of any other vehicle or interfere with or to injure, damage, or endanger persons or property engaged in the lawful use of the street.
- (B) <u>Drag Racing Unlawful.</u> No person shall be a participant in drag racing as defined in **Section 5/11-504 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes**.
- (C) <u>Fleeing or Attempting to Elude Police Officer.</u> Any driver or operator of a motor vehicle who, having been given a visual or audible signal by a police officer directing such driver or operator to bring his vehicle to a stop, willfully fails to or refuses to obey such direction, increases his speed, extinguishes his lights or otherwise flees or attempts to elude the officer is guilty of a violation of this Chapter. The signal given by the so as to

police officer may be by hand, voice, siren, red or blue light. Provided, however, the officer giving such signal shall be in police uniform and if driving a vehicle, such vehicle shall be marked showing it to be an official police vehicle.

- (D) <u>Unlawful Possession of Highway Sign or Marker.</u> The Department of Local Authorities with reference to traffic control signals, signs or markers owned by the Department of Local Authorities are authorized to indicate the ownership of such signs, signals or markers on the back of such devices in letters not less than **three-eighths (3/8) of an inch** or more than **three-fourths (3/4) of an inch** in height, by use of a metal stamp, etching or other permanent means and except for employees of the Department of Local Authorities, police officers, contractors and their employees engaged in highway construction, contract or work on the highway approved by the Department of Local Authorities, it is a violation of this Chapter for any person to possess such sign, signal or marker so identified. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-313)
- (E) <u>Special Speed Limitations on Elevated Structures.</u> No person shall drive a vehicle over any bridge or other elevated structure constituting a part of a highway at a speed which is greater than the maximum speed which can be maintained with safety to such bridge or structure when such structure is sign-posted.

Upon the trial of any person charged with the violation of this Section, proof of the determination of the maximum speed by the Village and the existence of such signs is conclusive evidence of the maximum speed which can be maintained with safety to such bridge or structure. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-608)

- (F) <u>General Speed Restrictions.</u> The speed limits on the various streets shall be approved by the Village Board, but shall not exceed **twenty miles per hour (20 MPH)** in a school zone and not to exceed **twenty-five miles per hour (25 MPH)** on a residential street; otherwise, **thirty miles per hour (30 MPH)** on an arterial street unless otherwise posted. (See Schedule "D") (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-604)
- (G) Special Speed Limit While Passing Schools. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of twenty miles per hour (20 MPH) while passing a school zone or while traveling upon any public thoroughfare on or across which children pass going to and from school during school days when school children are present.

This Section shall not be applicable unless appropriate signs are posted upon streets and maintained by the Village or State wherein the school zone is located. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-605)

(H) <u>Failure to Reduce Speed.</u> A vehicle shall be driven upon the streets and alleys of this Village at a speed which is reasonable and proper with regard to traffic conditions and the use of the street or alley. The fact that the vehicle does not exceed the applicable maximum speed limit does not relieve the
