Published in pamphlet form by authority of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Dupo, St. Clair County, Illinois, this 4th day of May 2020.

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WHEREAS, the Village of Dupo, St. Clair County, Illinois (the "Village"), is a duly created, organized and validly existing municipality of the State of Illinois under the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including particularly the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed public meeting was held in the Village of Dupo, Illinois at the Dupo Village Hall, 107 N. Second Street, on May 4, 2020 at 7:00 p.m., before the Village Board of Dupo, and such meeting was held remotely due to the Governor's Executive Orders pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic and such allowed for remote attendance by the public and the Village Board; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Village's Revised Code of Ordinances, Sections 38-4-9 and 38-4-10, the Village has established tap-on fees for connecting to the Village's Water System; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Village ("Corporate Authorities") have determined that the costs and expenses of connecting to the Village's Water System has increased; and

WHEREAS, after careful investigation, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village to increase the tap-on fees for connecting to the Village's Water System; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the tap-on fees shall be increased and amended as set forth in attached Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is advisable and in the best interest of the Village to modify and amend Sections 38-4-9 and 38-4-10 of the Village's Revised Code of Ordinances in that amended form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Dupo, St. Clair County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The following recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dupo, Illinois.

Section 2. Chapter 38, Article IV, Division II, Sections 38-4-9 and 38-4-10 of the Revised Code of Ordinances of the Village of Dupo, Illinois as adopted January 1, 2016, is hereby amended to read as follows:

<u>Section 3.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately upon passage and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.

38-4-9 WATER TAP-ON FEES.

- (A) Residential Inside Village. Connections to the Village Water System shall be made by the Village and the cost for connecting such service to an existing water main, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, is Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per residence, for a one (1) inch line. Provided, however, that in the event any connection requires more than eight (8) man-hours of labor to complete, then, in that event, the cost of such labor over eight (8) man-hours will be added to the applicant's connection cost. Further, if the tap-on requires additional materials and supplies, which are not of a typical residential water tap inside the Village, then, in that event, the Village will advise the applicant prior to the commencement of work, and the applicant shall be liable for any such additional costs and expenses.
- (B) Residential Outside Village. Applicants for water service outside the Village may be accepted if there is an existing acceptable main in a street or right-of-way abutting the premises to be served. Easements shall be furnished without cost to the Village for the installation and maintenance of service lines and for existing mains, which mains shall become the property of the Village. The Village may authorize the extension of a main at the expense of the applicant in areas not served by a Village-owned water main. Applicants shall pay the Village a tap on fee of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) per residence, plus the cost of labor, materials and supplies for a one (1) inch line.
- (C) Commercial Inside Village. Connections to the Village Water System shall be made by the Village and the cost for connecting such service to an existing water main, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, is Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for either a one (1) inch line, a two (2) inch line, a three (3) inch line, or four (4) inch line, per commercial facility, plus the cost of labor, materials and supplies.
- (D) Commercial Outside Village. Applicants for water service outside the Village may be accepted if there is an existing acceptable main in a street or right-of-way abutting the premises to be served. Easements shall be furnished without cost to the Village for the installation and maintenance of service lines and for existing mains, which mains shall become the property of the Village. The Village may authorize the extension of a main at the expense of the applicant in areas not served by a Village-owned water main. Commercial and Industrial Applicants shall pay the Village a tap-on fee of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per facility, plus the cost of labor, and materials and supplies for a one (1) inch line, Five Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500.00) per facility, plus the cost of labor, and materials and supplies for a two (2) inch line, Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) per facility, plus the cost of labor, materials and supplies for a three (3) inch line, and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per facility, plus the cost of labor, materials and supplies for a four (4) inch line.
- (E) Other Commercial Expenses. A non-metered fire sprinkler will have a tap fee of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00). A Three Hundred Fifty Dollar (\$350.00) multiple unit fee will be charged for each unit within a multiple unit building, in addition to a direct connection fee for each unit as listed above. (Ord. 38-4-10 SPECIAL TAP-IN CONTRACTS: IMBS STATION ROAD.

- (A) The cost of connecting water service for users making connection to the Water Service Extension of the Village over and along **Imbs Station Road** shall be **One Thousand Dollars** (\$1,000.00), plus the cost of installation. The cost of installation shall be estimated by a representative designated by the Village.
- (B) In the event a new water main or extension is required to be constructed to provide service, then, in that event, the users seeking to connect such new main or extension will be assessed a proportionate share of the costs required in the construction of such main or its extension.
